


May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. - Romans 15:13

I don't know about you, but the years just seem to go zipping by faster and faster. I can remember when 2000 seemed a long time off, and now here it is 2017 already. And how things continue to change. I am sure we can all remember things that were and now are, and, it will continue to be so.

We at Zion are in for some changes as we move into 2017, as well as perhaps some new realities. Hopefully it won't be too much longer and we will be calling our new pastor. There will be some adjustments and changes as she/he has their own ideas as to how ministry is to be done in this place. We need to be open to those ideas and changes.

I think we are also going to be confronted with some new



realities. Our attendance has been dropping over recent years. We are not the large congregation we have been used to being. We are getting to be an older congregation. It was a delight to see the young people put on the Christmas Pageant, and there were quite a few of them, but where are they the rest of the year? And as we age, we get fewer and fewer. This is not just an issue for Zion, but is an issue for the ELCA and most of our congregations. I think we will begin to see more and more mergers, closures and multiple congregations sharing pastors and staff. We are seeing some of that here as we are doing joint confirmation ministry with St. Paul as well as contemplating sharing youth ministry staff. We also experienced it with the closing of Resurrection. The only thing that will change this



trend is if we, as individual members take seriously our call to be disciples, sharing the story of our faith with all whom we meet. We need to be asking people to come and worship with us. This is not just the job of the pastor. We are all called to be disciples.

The other thing that comes with the loss of members, is the loss of income. If the pews are not filled, neither will be the offering plates. With the loss of income comes the inability to afford programs we have been used to doing. It might also mean reducing staff. Again, in some cases, this has also meant sharing pastors or closing. It is not just a Lutheran thing. Look at what has happened to our Roman Catholic neighbors. In Port Clinton, one of the Lutheran parishes is sharing a pastor with the Episcopal congregation. Unless our offerings increase, we will not be able to continue the ministries we have been used to.

However, we need to remember that with God all things are possible. If we are willing to commit ourselves to Him we can continue to do our ministry in this place in His name, in the ways in which we have become accustomed. As a New Year's resolution, let us rededicate ourselves to God and His ministry, in the Name of Christ.

Reunite

At separate meetings held this month, the boards of Capital and Trinity approved a resolution expressing their mutual commitment to pursue reunion. Reuniting Capital and Trinity also provides the opportunity to define and implement a sustainable business model focused on four key strategies:



- Developing new revenue streams through increased gift and grant opportunities
- Developing new enrollment revenue streams through the creation of new academic programs.
- Optimizing the use of property, buildings and other physical assets; and
- Integrating operations and reducing redundancies

These four strategies, and locations just across the street from one another, will facilitate a successful reunion. A transition team will be formed to study, develop and implement the right reunion plan. Work is underway, and will continue throughout the academic year. It's anticipated that a formal agreement that honors the institutions and all stakeholders-existing and future- will be finalized for approval by both boards by mid-summer 2017, with implementation to follow over the next two years.
