Grace and peace from the one who died that we might have life.

At our November congregational meeting, we adopted the vision and mission statements:

Vision Statement

From generation to generation, we live as friends following Jesus.

Mission Statement

Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church of Sandusky, Ohio,
helps families and friends communicate their faith with each other;
worships and works together across generations;
welcomes all people as they are;
raises up good stewards of God's gifts; and
feeds others with the gifts and talents God has given us.

The vision statement has become part of our worship and begun to influence sermons while the mission statement has been working in the background shaping the new ministry team structure. In Lent, these will both be brought forward and structure our time together in worship during Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, the vision statement will focus us on what it means that Jesus has declared us his friends—we who are dust become friends of God. For the Saturdays and Sundays of Lent, we'll work through each part of the mission statement, hearing how the readings for each weekend encourage us to communicate our faith, worship and work together, welcome all people, raise up good stewards, and feed others. Once we finish Bishop Beaudoin's Bible study on the Sermon on the Mount in my Children of Zion class, I'll begin going in depth on the rationale behind the vision and mission statements. Check your bulletins for that transition.



On Tuesday evenings in Lent, we'll be doing evening prayer for Lent and focusing on helping families and friends communicate their faith with each other. This will happen in two ways. As part of the Lenten soup suppers, we'll be doing new member classes. This will give an opportunity for current members to get to know the new members while also providing a chance to talk about faith. During each of the Tuesday evening services, I will interview a member of the congregation about their faith as part of the service. This two-fold approach will give us a chance to listen to others talk about their faith and share our own.

The Wednesday worship and lunch provides another opportunity to communicate our faith, but with a different focus. We'll be using the Cross Marked litanies for Lent each week, and they pair well with the parts of the mission statement. As part

of that time together, we'll be talking about how we find encouragement to live into our mission through the story of Jesus' crucifixion.

Another exciting element of our worship during Lent will be surrounding in prayer and fellowship someone who has been worshipping with us for almost a year now as he prepares for baptism on Easter—Aiden Cox. As we welcomed those getting ready to affirm their faith into the catechism classes on the weekend of Jesus’ baptism, we will intentionally welcome Aiden as part of our worship. On Lent 1, he will be enrolled as a candidate for baptism. On Lent 3, we will present Aiden with one of the chief symbols of faith—the Apostles’ Creed—and a copy of Luther’s *Large Catechism*. (We’ve already given him a copy of the *Small Catechism*.) On Lent 4, we will stand with Aiden in the face of all those forces that defy God. On Lent 5, we will wrap Aiden in our prayers and present him a copy of *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*. This will culminate in his baptism on Easter as we also welcome other new members.



Lent is a time of preparation for celebration. Let us take these weeks to prepare to enter into the future God is preparing for us!

Carolyn's Corner . . .

As I read through the books of Leviticus and Numbers during our Year of Scripture study, two things that draw my attention are: 1) The Sabbatical year/Jubilee and 2) the assignment of duties.

In Leviticus 25, God directs Moses to observe every seventh year as a rest year – a time out – for the fields and crops. They are allowed to eat what the land might yield without being planted or tilled. Every 50th year is a Jubilee Year. Verse 10-15: And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family. That fiftieth year shall be a jubilee for you: you shall not sow, or reap the after growth, or harvest the unpruned vines. For it is a jubilee; it shall be holy to you: you shall eat only what the field itself produces. In this year of jubilee you shall return, every one of you, to your property. When you make a sale to your neighbor or buy from your neighbor, you shall not cheat one another. When you buy from your neighbor, you shall pay only for the number of years since the jubilee; the seller shall charge you only for the remaining crop years. It continues.

Think about what it might be like if, after 50 years everything returned to its original owner. I know this isn't possible in our world, but imagine! As we read on in Leviticus 25, God instructs Moses in the care and nurturing, not only of the land, but also the poor. Here, it is about preserving the land for the Israelite clans.

The second point is about the assignment of duties. As the Israelites traveled and camped along the way, they carried the Ark of the Covenant, the Tabernacle, and all its fixtures with them. At each camp the tabernacle was erected according to God's instructions. What caught my attention is that God gave each of the twelve tribes a specific duty to be responsible for, a specific place to camp, and an order for their march. The tribe of Levi (Levites) was assigned to temple duty; others to carrying the curtains of the tabernacle, etc. Bezelel and Oholiab were God's chosen artisans.

So, what is your gift? What has God given you to fulfill your role in carrying out God's ministry at Zion? In your community? In your daily life? In the near future you will have an opportunity to explore your gifts and what they can mean to our ministry together. God has given each of us a gift/skill/talent with which we can serve and all of our gifts fit together to do the whole. Thanks be to God!

As We Were. . .

Zion is member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The ELCA came into existence on January 1, 1988, by the merging of three Lutheran church bodies. Zion was a member of the old American Lutheran Church (ALC) in 1918. The churches of the ALC of German heritage joined with the United Evangelical Lutheran Church (UELCA) and the Evangelical Lutheran to form the new American Lutheran Church in 1960. In 1988 the ALC, the LCA (Lutheran Church in America), and the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches (this group broke from the Missouri Synod Church) to form the ELCA.

The establishment of the ELCA and Zion's membership in it was announced in Pastor Bauerle's report in the June, 1987 Zionews.

Dear Member and Friend of Zion:

With the establishment of the New Lutheran Church, of which we are a part, there are many things to which we must be alerted. First of all beginning Jan. 1st, 1988, our nation headquarters will be in Chicago, with our Synod headquarters, of the NW Synod of Oh. being in Findlay, Ohio. By the way, we will have to get accustomed to calling our local areas Synods instead of districts. Our Bishop will be James Rave, who was one of the assistants on the Ohio District staff. You may be interested to know that our present Ohio District Bishop will be Bishop of the NE Synod of Ohio. He is Robert Kelly. Reginald Holle, who is known to many of you is going to be Bishop of the Western Synod of Michigan, while David Wolber was defeated in the Florida Synod. (We don't know what he will be doing). We are also in the process of writing a new constitution for Zion to coincide with the request of our new Synod, which is the merger of The American Lutheran Church, the Lutheran Church in America, and the American Evangelical Lutheran Church. We will be known as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America after this coming January 1st.
